Publications: The Universe is offering two special publications

'The Vatican (Past and Present)' at £3.50 – a glossy A4 colour publication, featuring stunning artwork and photography. As well as making fascinating reading it will be an excellent keepsake or gift, including features such as a Vatican virtual tour of St Peter's Basilica, Papal vestments, the newly restored Pauline Chapel and much more.

'Pius XII – a Saint in the Making'. Few Popes through history will elicit such an immediate reaction as the Venerable Pope Pius XII. Catholics and non-Catholics alike will instantly split into pro- and anti-Pius camps at the very mention of his name. Yet this was not always the case. Immediately after the Second World War Pope Pius was widely lauded throughout the world. Statesmen and world leaders fell over themselves in heaping praise on the Holy Father, and the Chief Rabbi of Rome himself converted to Catholicism, taking the baptismal name Eugenio in his honour. In this biographical study Michael Winterbottom looks at the fascinating life of this most patrician yet humble Pope, and looks at what led to the start of a virtual industry, an industry with the sole aim of defaming the memory of Pope Pius XII. This 104-page book, priced at only £4.99, also contains some wonderful archive photographs, many from the annals of The Universe Catholic Weekly.

A third is 'A St Joseph Prayer Book', a 64-page booklet produced along the same lines as other very popular Family Publications prayer books about Lourdes, St Thérèse of Lisieux and the Curé of Ars, with which you may already be familiar. This new prayer book contains popular as well as lesser-known prayers to St Joseph, and litanies and novenas etc. The prayers are accompanied by scriptural texts and quotations from the saints and from recent Popes. One of the striking features of these new booklets is the beauty of the sacred artwork, printed in full colour. The images are combined with the texts and prayers, old and new, which together offer a wealth of spiritual material that is conducive to mediation and prayer.
