Papal Visit Details: On Friday, 17 September, during Mass at 7:30 pm in St Ambrose's we shall invite all those who will be attending the Mass at Cofton Park to come together for a Commissioning, because we shall be attending as representatives of our Parish Community, taking the prayers and intentions for Pope Benedict, and our greetings to him, on behalf of our fellow parishioners.

Attention all Pilgrims to Cofton Park: Please read the information on your Pilgrim Passport carefully, but note that his will not admit you to Cofton Park. Your Pass Bracelet, which you will receive on entering the coach at Winterfold School must be worn at all times and is your only means of access to Cofton Park. Arrive early, as coaches leave Winterfold promptly at 5:50 am. No delay! There are three coaches allocated to St Ambrose's Pilgrims – EBH125, EBH126, EBH127. Our pilgrims must travel on one of these coaches. You must have some identification with your recent photograph on it. Bring your Magnificat book, your Pilgrim Pack and a pen. You may bring a small chair and a picnic. Be prepared to carry them. Food, water and toilets are on site. If you leave the park at any time for whatever reason you will not be readmitted. Departure from Cofton Park is at 4:00 pm. Please be at the coach at least 10 minutes before departure.

Thanks to Rob Cotgrave, we shall be able to have large-screen viewing of the Mass at Cofton Park in the Adams Lounge from 8:30 am on BBC2. The picture quality will be excellent and precise. Margaret Blizard has kindly agreed to open the Lounge from 8:00 am and tea and coffee will be available throughout. I hope that many parishioners will take up this very thoughtful provision.

Pope Benedict XVI's historic visit to the Midlands will be covered extensively on BBC Midlands Today, BBC local radio and BBC websites. Midlands Today is making a programme about the day itself which it is anticipated will go out after the 10 O'clock News on 19 September.
