- (ii) The Mite Scheme: Parishioners' generosity means that in the three months since we started the scheme here we have sent £87 to UNICEF for the purchase of at least 1,740 rehydration sachets, much needed in refugee camps for victims of war or natural disaster. Any coins are welcome, and special thanks to those people who are saving on a regular basis. Every single 5p is a lifeline to a sick infant, so even the smallest gift is the gift of life to someone.
