Petition: Please support Pro-Life Midwives. The Society for the Protection of Unborn Children (SPUC) has launched a petition to defend the right of nurses and midwives not to participate in abortion. The right to conscientious objection is under threat and Catholic and other pro-life doctors, nurses, midwives and pharmacists are coming under growing pressure to participate in the abortion process, despite having deeply-held pro-life and religious convictions. SPUC is backing the appeal case of Mary Doogan and Connie Wood, supervisor midwives at the Southern General Hospital, Glasgow, following an extremely worrying court decision earlier this year. The management at the Southern General re-interpreted the conscience clause in the Abortion Act and said that Connie and Mary were no longer allowed to object to supervising the work of other midwives performing abortions. The pair fought against this decision and took the hospital to court. In February a judge backed the hospital, stripping the midwives of their right to conscientious objection and, effectively, their jobs. The judgment has extremely serious implications for Catholic and other pro-life midwives, doctors, nurses and pharmacists all across Britain. Please sign SPUC's petition to the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) today, calling on the NMC to defend nurses' and midwives' right to conscientious objection.
