FINANCES:

Clergy Training Fund: There are currently 12 men in formation in the Diocese, studying at Oscott, at Valladolid and in Rome, and the Fund supports their training and education. Parishioners may contribute to the Fund annually or on a monthly basis and there is no need to commit to a fixed amount. Annual contributions are usually made in January. And, of course, if contributors are UK tax payers they may sign up to Gift Aid their donations, which increases the amount the Fund received at no further cost to the donor.
