Thanks: I am, as always, very grateful for the Easter offering, and for so many cards, greetings and gifts. The kindness of our parishioners is very affirming, and appreciated.

Parish Administrator: In recent years, smaller parishes than ours, and with fewer responsibilities than we have, have decided to engage a Parish Administrator. In the past few months I have not been able to attend to administrative matters in the Parish and in the Deanery, and in other places also, as efficiently as I would wish. On occasions some parishioners have been left anxious because of delays in returning communications etc. I am grateful that Joseph Moran has agreed to work with me as Parish Administrator. As this is a new venture, it may take some time to define the position exactly, but I envisage that he will be able to provide administrative and secretarial support. I hope that he will handle all Parish correspondence, the management of the various diaries that we have to keep, co-ordinate details and arrangements for Baptisms, Marriages, Funerals, and Sacramental programmes in conjunction with the School. Also, he will help in my work in the Deanery and with Winterfold School. Initially I am going to form a consultative group with the Deacons, and representatives of various areas of Parish life, so that all our activities can be properly co-ordinated, and a better sense of community can emerge. Joseph will be an important part of this. It is not intended that he should replace anyone (eg Newsletter typists and those who draw up the various rotas) but will, I hope, enhance our efficiency. Please pray that this initiative will prove fruitful for all of us. Joseph and I will go to Walsingham on 8 May to ask Our Lady's help for this new venture.

Funeral Services: There will be a Funeral Service for the infant Terry Baker on Wednesday afternoon at 2.00 pm, and she will be buried in the Children's section of Kidderminster Cemetery. Gill Pardoe's body will be brought to Church on Wednesday at 4.30 pm, and she will be buried in Kidderminster Cemetery after her Funeral Mass at 2.00 pm on Thursday. May they rest in peace.
