<u>STOP PRESS</u>: The Vicar General attended a meeting at Our Lady's on Thursday evening and indicated that, in line with Diocesan Pastoral Policy, the number of Masses in our Parish at the weekend should be reduced from four to three. The Archbishop's Council has proposed that the main focus of Sunday Mass provision should be in St Ambrose's, and the Sacred Heart Church in Tenbury. A consequence of this would be that the Sunday Mass be discontinued at Our Lady's, and that the Church should close. This proposal will be considered by the Archbishop's Council in the light of the observations made on Thursday evening, and we must now await a decision.
