Recorded Music at Church Services: Twelve years ago it was decided that recorded music would no longer be used at Funerals, Weddings and other events in Church, except to support the singing at School Masses and productions. Recently, in an exceptional circumstance, approval was given for a single item to be played, but not in the context of the Funeral Mass. This has, unfortunately, caused offence to other families who, understandably, believe that any decisions of this kind should apply to everyone. I regret the distress caused by this recent approval. In the interests of equitableness, the decision not to use recorded music is now re-stated, and there can be no exceptions to this. Recorded music, with the approval of the Parish Priest, and at his discretion, may be used at the Reception of the Body to the Church on the night before a Funeral, and at any social gathering afterwards according to the wishes of the family.
