

On Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, a Parish Priest is bound by Canon Law to offer one Mass for the people of the Parish. Sometimes Masses are requested far in advance, and it is often not possible to re-arrange previous requests. We do hope that that parishioners understand when it is not possible to arrange a Mass on a specific day, though we shall continue to do our best to honour requests as they are received.

PILGRIMS of HOPE: During this Jubilee Year we are asked to think of ourselves as 'Pilgrims of Hope' (Pope Francis). During these summer weeks Elizabeth Fox has suggested that some of our parishioners should share some thoughts with us: Pilgrim's Progress? We have been asked to share our experiences on Pilgrimage and this is my story. My husband and I were greatly disappointed that we had been unable to have children during our thirteen years of marriage. IVF had become available but I refused and prayed always for the grace to accept God's will. In 1980 we were meandering through Brittany in our VW campervan and came across a place of pilgrimage in Callac. It is practically unknown and, indeed, on the occasions we have returned there, we have not met anyone else and enjoyed a private audience with Our Lord and his Blessed Mother. It is a hill with the Stations of the Cross and on descending, there is a Grotto with Our Lady's Statue. Without even conferring, my husband and I prayed desperately for the family we longed for. Our prayers were heard and our daughter was born 10 months later and our son the following year. Our miracle children know this is our special place and we have returned several times as a family to thank God and we have a plaque at the Grotto denoting our answered prayer. When I shared this with my son he immediately said, "Let's go again soon." - Madeleine Roy.
